Barcaldine Freshwater Hatchery (Nov 2013-Present), Scottish Sea Farms (SSF)

Construction of a new £40M freshwater salmon hatchery in Argyll using recirculation systems to recycle 99% of the water, the latest technology to control the environment, and the highest standards of fish welfare and biosecurity. NLC were appointed at project inception. Greg has managed all aspects through feasibility, options appraisal and site selection, design, planning, tendering and construction/contract administration. *See Project Case Study for full details.*

Thomas Telford Corpach Marina (Jan 2017-Present), Caol Regeneration Company

A community project to construct an all-year round marina facility at the western gateway of the Caledonian Canal. NLC are securing £3m grant funding; preparing outline design and contract documentation; procuring contractors and project managing the works on site. Greg initially worked on the grant funding applications, outline design and tender documentation for Phase 1 before handing responsibility to other team members.

Caithness-Moray HVDC Cable (Mar 2015-Oct 2016), Daviot Group

Project for SHETL to transmit power from windfarms in Caithness, under the Moray Firth to a new sub-station at Keith, Moray and onto the grid. NLC's client were responsible for the £45m work package to install the cable on land (28km in Caithness, 22km in Moray), including access tracks, wayleaves, excavation, cable pulling, backfilling and re-instatement. Greg and a team from NLC were responsible for all planning and programming of the works progress reporting and assessing the impact of compensation events.
